Personal electronic device guidelines for students

You'll need personal electronic devices to enhance your learning, participate in class and study in your own time. This includes a laptop, headphones, mobile phone, and battery pack (power bank). The following guide gives you an overview of the types of computer devices you will need to complete your studies with us.

Make sure your devices are suitable to carry around campus

When bringing your devices to campus, here are a few things to consider:



Battery life

We have charging stations and power points on campus but if you are moving around campus on a daily basis, we recommend you bring a battery pack (power bank) to ensure your laptop, headphones and phone are charged up at all times.

There are limited opportunities to recharge devices during classes, so devices will need to have sufficient battery life to use for several hours without recharging.

An ideal battery life is 10 hours or more.



Laptop

A laptop is required to complete your studies at UTS College. Please check the table on the next page to make sure your device meets the requirements for your course.



Size and weight

Devices need to be brought to class daily so these will need to be a practical weight and size to carry around all day.

We recommend a maximum weight of 2kg.



Headphones

Headphones are required. These can be wired or wireless. Wireless headphones should have a minimum 10 hours between charges.



Wi-Fi

UTS College students can access UTS College Wi-Fi while on campus.
